

Cutt-N-Sew Quilt Shop, 27 W. School St., Bonne Terre, MO 63628 Phone 573-358-7887. Hours: M-F 9am-4pm, Sat 9am-3pm is one of 2 quilt shops located in this small town. The owner –

Saundra Cramp has been in business at this location for 14 years. This is your basic quilt shop with fabric patterns, thread, no classes are offered

but the owner opens the shop in the evening once or twice a month for open sewing where customers can bring in their own projects to work on. The shop has a decent amount of fabric in two rooms with seasonal fabric in the room to the left (I saw a decent amount of Christmas fabric, fall fabric, Halloween fabric, 2 shelves of batiks and a

decent assortment of wide backing fabric).

The shop offers machine quilting with 3 long-arm machines with computer assisted quilting.

Bonne Terre, MO 63628 Phone 314-6031809. It wasn't open. I'll try to check them out the next time I'm in the St. Louis area and will let you know what I find out. At this time, I can neither recommend or pass on the shop.
